Statement | EHRI Condemns Russia's Invasion of Ukraine



Monday, 28 February, 2022

The European Holocaust Research Infrastructure (EHRI) strongly condemns the recent invasion of Ukraine by Russia, and is gravely concerned about its impact on civilians, not to mention other living beings and the land. As a research infrastructure devoted to the study of genocide and war, we are shocked that an unprovoked and inexcusable attack on a sovereign country is possible in Europe in the 21st century. If only because of our own research, we are sensitive to the death toll, violence and trauma brought about by this war.

EHRI is both a digital infrastructure and a transnational human network of experts. In view of the danger to Ukraine's Holocaust researchers and their families, we strongly encourage them to let us know about their current situation and needs, no matter if they are in Ukraine or if they seek refuge abroad. We at EHRI will share this information within our professional network and will mediate contacts and offers of aid.

During the Second World War, more than one million Jews were murdered on the territory of Ukraine in mass shootings, in ghettos and concentration camps or through slave labour. Free research about Ukraine is essential for advancing humanity's knowledge about the persecution and genocide of Jews, Roma and other groups, and EHRI is privileged to have the **Center for Urban History of East Central Europe** in Lviv as its partner.

Our concern about the future of Holocaust research in Ukraine is increased by the blatant lies of Russian state propaganda about the alleged need to "denazify" Ukraine. We strongly reject the cynical use of this vocabulary for the purpose of occupying another country and preventing its free development as a democracy.

The scientific journals of CegeSoma: a mine for the history of the world wars!

We already had the pleasure of offering to those who do us the honor of reading a small overview of the Center's collections of informational or militant periodicals concerning roughly the period 1930-1950.




Is it necessary to specify this? This collection, of a certain richness for the "fine" approach of this time period, would be somewhat

orphaned, conceptually speaking, if it had not been completed by an equally important set of scientific journals directly related to the two world conflicts or, more broadly, to the history of the "short 20th century" apprehended under its political, social, economic and military aspects.

The "founding fathers" of our institution made a very wide selection from the outset, accumulating the great classic

titles. Over the years, with the extension of the institution's "Mission Statement", new scientific periodicals were added to cover the fields of investigation that were becoming our own.



Thus, at the beginning, in addition to "our" own journal (the *Cahiers/Bijdragen*), we also had the complete collection of the venerable *Revue d'Histoire de la Deuxième Guerre*

mondiale (from its first issue in November 1950), as well as that of the no less venerable *Vierteljahrshefte für Zeitgeschichte* (dated 1955), and of course those of their respective successors! In the case of the first mentioned title, it is *Vingtième Siècle - Revue d'Histoire* and *Guerres mondiales et Conflits contemporains*, which already accumulate a good number of years. The Belgian publications are, for a long time, very present as regards the academic research with the *Belgian Review of Contemporary History/Belgisch Tijdschrift voor Nieuwste Geschiedenis* (which ended up absorbing, on the long

term, the review of the Center in its last version, i.e. the *Cahiers d'Histoire du Temps* présent/Bijdragen tot de Eigentijdse Geschiedenis...) but also the *Revue belge de*



Philologie et d'Histoire and the *Revue d'Histoire ecclésiastique*. Other titles were introduced over time, such as the *Cahiers de la Mémoire contemporaine/Bijdragen tot de Eigentijdse Herinnering* or the *Wetenschappelijke Tijdingen*, some of which were published by the *Stichting voor Eigentijdse Herinnering*, others by the *ADVN*, but also a

number of foreign publications concerning the contemporary period, such as the *Journal of*

Contemporary History, the *Journal of Modern European History*, and *Italia Contemporanea*.

Over the last few decades, the fall of the "Soviet bloc" opened up new historiographical avenues, and the introduction of titles with a strong flavour (?) of the "zeitgeist"was not overlooked. But before that, we had already been interested in all the issues related to the

genocidal policies carried out during the Second World War (*Holocaust and Genocide Studies, Revue d'Histoire de la Shoah*, Yad Vashem Studies,...) before focusing, for a while, on the First World War (*First World War Studies*) or more extensively on the Cold War (*Journal of Cold War Studies*).



Besides this very professional, highly academic and, to say the least, very "technical"

approach to history, there are of course many more general but equally intellectual journals, both Belgian and foreign, which readily address our themes and can nourish historical reflection: We are also very well supplied in this matter with *La Revue générale, La Revue nouvelle*, but also *Le Débat, Esprit* and even the *Revue des Deux Mondes*... Although, in these last mentioned cases, we do not possess complete collections contrary to the properly scientific publications mentioned above, we have been able to glean "the substance" of them!





They are thus dozens and dozens of titles obtained by subscription or by acquisition through antiquarianism. And, as one can guess, not all the subjects that are dealt with in

them are necessarily of direct interest to the researchers attending our institution. But to help them in their task, a reasoned selection of contributions likely to refine knowledge of the two world conflicts has been systematically carried out by the manager responsible for the Library since 1991. This choice is, of course, somewhat subjective ! But, in the end, is this not often the case in the human sciences?

A final observation, before we take our leave: most of these journals are now "online", which facilitates their



access, given that a certain number of issues, in the case of less well-established or least widespread publications, have still not benefited from digitization and must be consulted on site.

From 1945 to 1948, one of the largest detention complexes ever to exist in Belgium was located in the small town of Erbisoeul. Over fifty thousand German war prisoners transited, lived and worked there. CegeSoma is pleased to resume its Public History Meetings after several months of interruption. As our first guest, Pierre Muller shall present the history and unprecedented scale of this prison camp, as well as the living conditions of the prisoners and their relationship with the guards and local population. He shall also shed light on the key role that the camp played in the economic recovery of post-war Belgium.

Pierre Muller holds a degree in History from Catholic University of Louvain (UCL); he currently works for the War Heritage Institute and writes a doctoral research study about German war prisoners detained in Belgium after the Second World War.

In addition to this topic, his main field of interest is the history of mechanical warfare. He shall soon publish a work about the ten main tank battles of the Second World War, including those on Belgian battle grounds, in collaboration with Mathias André, assistant doctoral student at UNamur ...



Alain Colignon is a historian from University of Liège. He heads the library of CegeSoma/State Archives since many years.

Furthermore, he is the author of various works on the history of the occupation and the private life of the population in wartimes; he further specialises in the study of the Collaboration and the Resistance, and currently works on a publication about Walloon society in the years 1930-1940.



Study day on the occasion of the 10th anniversary of the JBH

In spring 2012 was published the first issue of the new *Journal of Belgian History (JBH*), which is a fusion of the predecessor of the current *JBH (Belgisch Tijdschrift voor Nieuwste Geschiedenis / Revue Belge d'Histoire Contemporaine*, 1969-2011, published by the Jan Dhondt Foundation of Ghent University) and the *Bijdragen tot de Eigentijdse Geschiedenis / Cahiers d'Histoire du temps Présent (BEG/CHTP*, 1996-2011, published by CegeSoma). This fusion in 2012 was accompanied by a new layout, a new website with interactive content and the addition of colour illustrations.

Ten years later, it is clear that the journal is a real success. In the course of this period, 142 articles were published - 48 of which in thematics issues – as well as numerous proceedings, contributions to the "debates" column and summaries of doctoral theses. The quality and diversity of the content is indeed impressive, and the contents of the coming issues are already lined up: mission accomplished!

But despite its success in the scientific field, the *JBH* can be criticised for being somewhat of a dinosaur within the current editorial landscape. Are paper editions indeed still pertinent in an era of free online access to publications? Is a journal with a general editorial line still viable in these times of increased specialisation? To which extent a journal that has 'Belgian contemporary history' in its French and Dutch titles is actually still contemporary? Which

role can such a journal still play in these times of transnational historiography, of the predominance of Englishlanguage publishing and of federalised scientific landscape? On the other hand, could we consider that all of the above challenges could paradoxically let the *JBH* stand out in its uniqueness. On the occasion of this 'anniversary' conference, we shall have a look at the past, but even more turn towards the future. A panel of historians shall examine national history and historiography form various perspectives. The conference shall be rounded off with a debate about the future of the *JBH* within an editorial landscape undergoing deep transformations.



Contemporary History Day





The Association belge d'Histoire contemporaine (of which CegeSoma is a member), in collaboration with *Zentrum für Ostbelgische Geschichte (ZOG)* and *Luxembourg Centre for Contemporary and Digital History (C2DH)* is pleased to invite you to the 2022 edition of the **Contemporary History Day**. After having been cancelled two years ago due to the pandemic, this biennial study day finally takes place on 20 May 2022.

This year's edition shall be dedicated to **public history in Belgium**. It will be the occasion to have a look at the current state of affairs and to share the outcomes of experiences intended to make history known and tangible beyond university campuses. This will also be an opportunity to address the issue of regional and local history, which is closely linked to public history as it is often penned by non-professional historians and forms a fertile breeding ground for historical counter-narratives of underrepresented social groups. *Ostbelgien* is a perfect example thereof and shall be highlighted during this study day.

The event shall take place in Eupen, in the historical and enchanting premises of *Kloster Heidberg*, just a few steps from the railway station of the capital of German-speaking Belgium. After the welcoming addresses by Messrs. Brüll & Fickers ($ZOG \& C^2DH$) and by Mr. Oliver Paasch, Minister-President of the German-speaking Community, the opening paper shall be presented by Ms. Aline Sax, professor at the Universities of Antwerp and Ghent, famous author of historical novels, research coordinator at *Geheugen Collectief* – and former president of the *Association*

Subsequently, three sessions shall take place in parallel under the gothic vaults of the monastery, before a reception offered by *ZOG* and *ABHC*.
