## Conference in Leuven about archives and historical research

From 6 to 7 June, the yearly international archival symposium will take place in the Belgian State Archives in Leuven. The theme of this year's conference is archives and scholarly research (*Archive und wissenschaftliche Forschung*).



Sébastien Dubois (operational director of the State Archives Wallonia) participates to the opening debate, which will be moderated by Eddy Put (head of the Operational Directorate Flanders of the Belgian State Archives). Nico Wouters (CegeSoma) will give a presentation about the archives and research about the Second World War in Belgium. The conference languages will be German and English, the subscription fee is 120 euro and you can register via rijksarchief.leuven@arch.be.

## Workshop Plunder of Art and Heritage in Belgium during the Second World War - 14 June 2019

Recently Patricia Grimsted, the well-known American researcher on the history of the German looting of art and heritage in Europe during World War II, has addressed a number of Belgian researchers with a request to follow up on earlier research and publication projects.



Amsab-ISH has recently started a volunteer project in reply to this request co-ordinated by Michel Vermote and in cooperation with CEGESOMA. Several researchers in many different research centres in Belgium have been involved in this research domain.

CEGESOMA and Amab-ISH organise a workshop in Brussels on 14 June 2019 to round up earlier and recent progress in research activities and to evaluate opportunities of future research. We will start off by presenting the recent initiatives by prof. Grimsted and invite researchers to comment and to make suggestions.

The workshop is free of charge and limited of scope as to participants, envisaging Belgian and international researchers involved, students working on connected topics and research networks active in this domain. Objectives of the workshop are to promote communication and networking among researchers and to provide opportunities for research and project proposals.

# War - occupation - liberation: a new book on Belgium during the Second World War

On May 8, a new permanent exhibition on the Second World War was opened at the Army Museum / War Heritage Institute. This exhibition is accompanied by a catalogue that looks at the Second World War from different angles. To the latter, CegeSoma researchers have made a significant contribution.



The book is by no means a "battle-history"; on the contrary, it highlights various social, political and cultural aspects of the history of the Second World War.

The latest research in this field is being integrated through a number of authors who have recently defended their doctoral thesis in the field of Second World War history.

"Confirmed" authors from different universities and research institutions, such as CegeSoma, have also contributed. The book opts for a broad chronological perspective, starting in the inter-war period, paying particular attention to liberation and not forgetting the weight of memory.

Finally, Belgium has been placed in a broader international context, as evidenced by the contribution of the renowned British historian Richard Overy, who concludes the book.

#### A book for the wider public

The book is intended for a wide audience. The (short) chapters take as their starting point a collector's piece that can also be seen in the exhibition.

The book is richly illustrated, but this does not affect its scientific accuracy: the chapters are accompanied by a endnotes and a bibliography closes the book.

In short, an ideal book for those looking for a readable and up-to-date overview of the impact of the Second World War on Belgian society.

The book is published in Dutch, French and English and costs  $\in$  29.99. It is on sale in bookshops and of course also in the museum shop on the occasion of the exhibition.
